- **EU Funds:** **European Defence Funds\***, Structural Funds, Just Transition Fund, InvestEU Fund, Connecting Europe Facility (CEF), Innovation and Modernisation Funds

# Erityistä juuri turvallisuustutkimuksen EU-hankkeissa

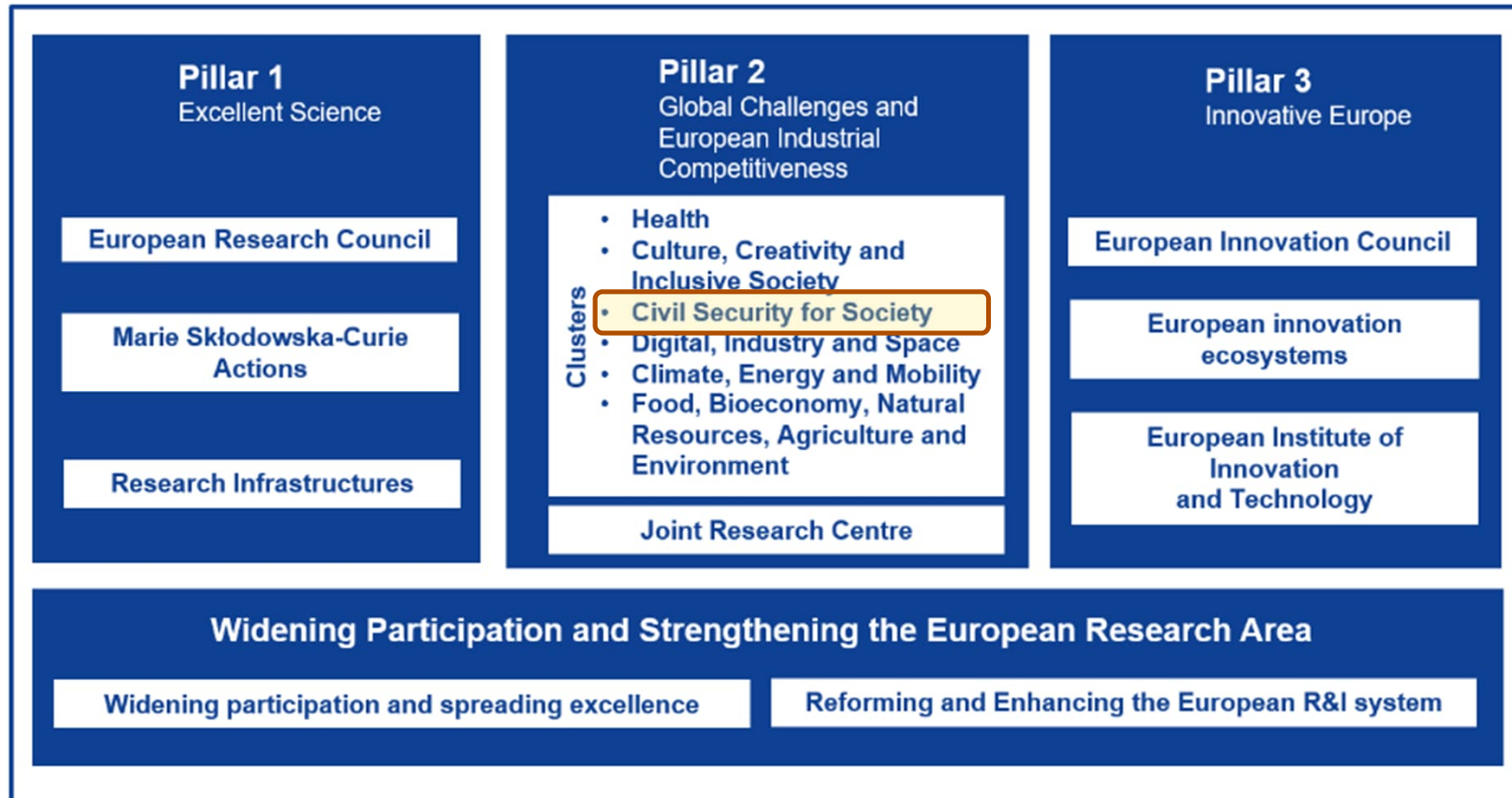
- Some activities may involve using **classified** background and/or producing of **security sensitive** results (EUCI and SEN).
  - Please refer to the related provisions in section B Security — EU classified and sensitive information of the General Annexes.
  - Komission arvioijat tekevät lopullisen päätöksen mahdollisista turvallisuusluokista.
- **Social sciences and humanities (SSH)**
  - Vaatimukset eettiselle ja sosiaalisesti kestäväälle toteutukselle ja vaikuttavuudelle kiristyneet jopa ohjelmakausien aikana
- Hankkeiden yhteistyön vaatimus jo ohjelmassa
- Jatkuvuus ei aina toteudu eli saatujen tuloksien jatkokehittäminen ei löydä rahoitusta EU-hankkeen jälkeen

## Six Destinations of HE CL3

- Destination – Better protect the EU and its citizens against Crime and Terrorism (FCT)
- Destination – Effective management of EU external borders (BM)
- Destination – Protected infrastructure (INFRA)
- Destination – Increased Cybersecurity (CS)
- Destination - A Disaster-Resilient Society for Europe (DRS)
- Destination – SSRI (Strengthened Security Research and Innovation)

### Huomioita:

- Teknologian ja toiminnan kehittämistä (kuten BM:ssä rajatarkastusten kehittämistä ja rajavalvonnan kehittämistä)
- Vaatii osaamisten yhdistämistä – pelkkä tekninen kehitys ei riitä
- Yhteiskunnallinen hyväksyttävyys

# Eligibility Conditions \* - some examples

In addition, **this topic** requires the active involvement of **at least**

- **3** Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) **from at least 3** different EU or Associated countries.
- **2** Law Enforcement Agencies from at least **2** different EU or Associated countries, **as well as** at least **2** First Responder organisations (non Law-Enforcement) from at least **2** different EU or Associated countries.

Combinations

- **5** Law Enforcement Authorities (LEAs) or forensic institutes, of which **at least 2 LEAs and at least 2 forensic institutes**
- **5** Law Enforcement Authorities (LEAs) or civil society organisations (CSOs), **of which at least 2 LEAs and at least 2 CSOs**
- **5** Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs), Border Guards Authorities and/or Customs Authorities, **of which at least 2 LEAs and at least 2 Border Guards Authorities**

\*) If eligibility conditions are not fully met, the proposal is rejected without evaluation.

# European Defense Fund (EDF)

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## EDF – to be noted

- Clear relations with PESCO\*.
- Clear relations with 11 Critical Development Priorities (CDP) but at detailed level some differences.
- Defence market is driven by Governments and not by consumers.
  - Governments set the scene (needs, requirements procurement etc.).
  - Therefore research (and development) is capability driven (not market-driven).
- Multi-annual view on work programme.
  - Consistent and coherent.
  - Not only at EU level but also national level.
  - Reflect an integrated R&D approach

# Funding rules and other eligibility criteria

- Research topics funded 100% + 25%
  - ~70% funding for VTT
- Development topics funded 20-90% + 25% based on the type of the activity
  - the rate may vary between work packages
- Development proposals require common requirement and support from a number of national MoDs (number to be defined) prio submission of the proposal
  - Eligibility criteria
  - Number of MoDs to be definedd (check the final call text)
- Employees from 3rd countries (note: UK a 3rd country)
- Only EU Member States and Norway full members of EDF (no UK)

# EDF – some key facts

- Research focus
  - Disruptive technologies:
    - 4% - 8% of total EDF budget; yearly adjustments suggested.
    - Beyond incremental work.
    - Technology potentially appears in all capability domains and technological fields.
  - Key enabling technologies.
    - Relevant for wider set of platforms and enhance interoperability.
- Development focus
  - Aimed at (future) high-end capabilities and broad cooperation throughout the EU and strengthening the European Defence Technological and Industrial Base (EDTIB),
  - Could be driver for (several) more specialized or specific actions.
- SME's
  - Involved in development programmes.
  - Dedicated SME calls.
